

# A Peek Into The Atrium

**The Child's Work** Throughout the year, you may not see a great volume of **paperwork** come home from the atrium. The child's work in the atrium is most often done with hands-on materials rather than on paper. With some of the materials, there may be follow-up work that is done with paper, pencil, coloring or pasting. As the child grows and develops, more work may be done on paper; this usually follows work with a manipulative material. As children move into the level II works at age 6 and older, the catechist more strongly encourages written work to follow work with the atrium material.

So, do not be concerned that a lack of paperwork coming home means a lack of productive time in the atrium. If you have an interest to know what works your child has been using, please ask his/her catechist. We track each child's work and presentations in the atrium on a weekly basis.
