

Our Lenten journey continues to unfold in the midst of all that surrounds us in our daily lives. Who of us is not been impacted by the concern and fear around the COVID-19 virus?

I was so disappointed when Archbishop Sartain was not able to come and be with us for our parish mission. Having spoken with Fr. Tim Ilgen, he too was disappointed in having to cancel the parish mission at Sacred Heart.

As I write this on March 5, I hear concerns about closing schools, about traveling, about not having enough hospital beds or enough trained professional healthcare workers to respond to the possibility of what might happen.

We can all get caught in our fears and allow our anxieties to overwhelm and overtake us, thereby stealing any peace in mind or heart.

This is why it is so essential to be rooted in prayer. This is why every year in Lent, we enter into the renewal of our Stewardship of Time, that is, our prayer. To be good stewards, to be faithful disciples of Jesus Christ, we must be rooted in prayer. It is essential that we take time for prayer every day, to encounter the love of the Father, the presence of Jesus and the power and strength of the Holy Spirit.

Disciples of Jesus Christ, faithful stewards are not like the rest of the world. We are not meant to be caught up in hysteria, fear and anxieties that blind us to the presence of God in our midst. If we are deeply rooted in our relationship with the Lord, we build our house, our lives, on the rock of Jesus Christ so that when the storms come, when the winds blow, when the rains of the news feeds lash against our psyche, we will not fall apart.

Come to adoration to encounter Jesus. Come to adoration to find peace. Come to adoration to be strengthened. Come to adoration and pray and intercede. Come to adoration to know your true center.

As one of my favorite hymns says, "No storm can shake my inmost calm while to

this rock I'm clinging." Let us hold fast to Jesus Christ who is our surest and lasting peace.

If you're not in a small group that reflects on our sacred Scriptures each week, please consider joining one in the near future. Please access our Lenten video series at our website or on the parish app.

Know that you are daily in my prayers. Let us hold one another in prayer this Lenten season and allow Jesus to be our surest hope.

In Christ, through the intercession of Blessed Pier Giorgio, I love you.

WEEK 4 - BLINDNESS

This week Amber and Stephen Holland share their reflection on the man born blind. Stephen was born and raised Catholic and Amber was not raised in the faith, so when they started dating in high school, this led to many conversations about Mary, the saints and the Eucharist. Amber shares how she relates to the blind man in that she was blind to the truth of the teachings of the Catholic Church. Her point of real conversion came when she had an argument with a professor at Gonzaga University about hormonal birth control.

She now realizes that, like the pharisees, she thought she was right and did research to prove her point. It was hard for her to overcome her blindness to see and admit that the Catholic Church was right and that contraception was wrong. She is thankful that they took a marriage course that introduced them to NFP (Natural Family Planning) which helped them gain a greater understanding of what it means to be a human person, both body and soul.

When we allow Jesus to open our lives, like the blind man, we are able to see. We need to realize that Christ founded the Church for a purpose and always work to conform our stubborn wills to His will.

Q: WHAT'S THAT QUOTATION FROM RATZINGER ON PENANCE!?

For a long time, I don't think I understood penance. I think this mostly came from a warped Protestant view of Christian anthropology (that is how we as Christians understand what a human being is). As I progressed through Seminary, I came across this quotation from Cardinal Ratzinger, now Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI. This quotation falls in the middle of a couple of other chapters that he was writing about a different topic, but it was one of the most lucid descriptions of Christian penance I have ever read. I quote it yearly during Ash Wednesday homilies, and I wanted to pass it along to you because some people have asked. Enjoy!



“Penance is a necessity for both the individual and the community. But Christian penance means, not self-rejection, but self-discovery. The ancient Acts of the Saints emphasize the fact that no word of complaint about creation ever crossed the lips of Christian martyrs . . . The inner precondition for penance is precisely the affirmation of oneself, [everything about oneself] of reality as such . . . Whenever the fundamental Yes to being, to life, to oneself, ceases to exist, penance disappears and turns into arrogance. For penance presumes that man is permitted to affirm himself [to say yes to our true creatureliness]. By its very nature, it is a penetration to the Yes in the hidden places of whatever obscures the Yes. That is why true penance leads to the Gospel, that is, to joy—even to joy in oneself . . . We must rediscover that luminous trail that is the history of the

saints and of the beautiful—a history in which the joy of the Gospel has been irrefutably expressed throughout the ages. Anyone who remembers only the Inquisition when he thinks of the Middle Ages should be asked where his eyes are. Could such cathedrals, such images of the eternal, full of light and quiet dignity, have been created if faith had been just an affliction for mankind? In a word, it must become clear again that penance requires, not the destruction of one's own identity, but the

finding of it.” – Joseph Cardinal Ratzinger, *Principles of Catholic Theology: Building Stones for a Fundamental Theology*, (San Francisco: Ignatius Press, 1987), p. 372-373


